Cory, shall have the right, if he selects, to take the land which I own in Rock Island County Illinois, to wit one hundred and sixty acres, at a value of eleven hundred and ten (\$110⁰⁰) dollars upon his paying to the said Mahlon and Emma A. such sum of money as shall be necessary to make their shares equal to his, if there should not be enough property beside said one hundred and sixty acres of land to make the shares of said Mahlon and Emma equal to the sum of eleven hundred and ten dollars;

Fifth: I appoint my wife Maria Cory, executrix of this will.

I, Maurice Wolfe of the Township of Liberty, County of Clinton and State of Iowa, being of sound and disposing mind and memory but enfeebled by sickness do make declare & publish this my last will and testament and direct as follows:

First: It is my will that after my death all my just debts be paid including the expenses of administration. Second: I give devise and bequeath to my beloved son Maurice Wolfe and to my daughter Mary, The North East quarter and the East half of the North West quarter of Section Sixteen (16) Township Eighty-two (82) North Range One (1) East 5th P.M. to have and to hold as their own forever and to their heirs and assigns. I also give devise and bequeath to them one team of horses, wagon and harness. Also, ten head of cows and ten head of hogs and two hundred and fifty dollars in cash to my said son Maurice and my daughter Mary, share and share alike, and the above personal property is to be whatever property may be chosen from the property I now own by my son Maurice. Third: I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Bridget five hundred dollars.

Fourth: I give devise and bequeath to my daughters Johanna Wolfe and Kate Stark five hundred dollars to each one of them.

Fifth: I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Margaret Mulvihill Five Hundred dollars,

Sixth: To my son Richard give devise and bequeath all he is owing me on rates and mortgagor in excess of fifteen hundred dollars, and I direct my Executor herein after named to indorse on said note, and to cancel and surrendered the same to my said son Richard in excess of Fifteen Hundred dollars.

Seventh: It is my wish that my executor herein after

named sell and dispose of all the rest and residue of my property both personal and real (except what is bequeath to my son Maurice and my daughter Mary in the second paragraph of this my will) and convert the same into cash as soon as he can and pay the legacies above bequeathed and the remainder of my estate after paying debts funeral expenses and Administrators expenses, and above legacies be divided between my sons James Wolfe, John Wolfe, Thomas Wolfe, Richard Wolfe and my daughters Ellen Mulvihill, Margaret Mulvihill, Kate Stoak, Johanna Wolfe and Bridget Wolfe share and share alike.

Eight. I nominate and appoint as sole executor of this my last Will and Testament, my beloved son Maurice Wolfe, and I exempt him from executing or giving any bonds or security, for the performance of his duties as such executor, hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made.

On this day come R. L. Divine and N. C. Warren, the executors named in the last Will and Testament of Martin Pabst, deceased, and the said N. C. Warren presents to the Court his declaration in writing to act as such Executor. And thereupon the said R. L. Divine presents to the Court the said Will together with his petition for the Probate of the same, and for Letters Testamentary thereon.
